COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Elective Course Descriptions not in the catalogue:

DT 579 What Really Happened at Vatican II (2 cr)

This course will examine the Second Vatican Council (1962-65), exploring the events leading up to the Council, the Council itself, and the impact of the Council on the Church today. Special emphasis will be placed on the Council in its historical context: Why was it called? What important events occurred within the Council, specifically the debates related to each of the sixteen documents? How was Vatican II a major shift in the Church's self-perception and perception of the world? And, finally, how does the Council continue to influence every aspect of Church life today?

MT 575 Moral Theology & Business Ethics (2 cr)

This course will present the basic concepts on Business Ethics, examine practical issues of managers in addressing ethical and moral problems in business and introduce the main issues in the field. It will draw on a variety of materials and experiences as a basis for analyzing and evaluating the manager and the firm options and decisions. The course will encourage students to think critically and to develop an analytical framework for thinking about business ethical problems.
